

Homework Non-Negotiables

In addition to the termly homework, we firmly believe that children need to consolidate key skills by completing these tasks.

READING

It is important to listen to your child read for around 20 minutes every day. Discuss the book together, talk about themes and genres, making predictions and links between books that have been read previously.

SPELLINGS

Spelling rules and list shall be given each week with activities to be completed at home. Spelling tests will take place at selected points in the year. Children should use their spellings in their writing as a way of embedding them.

TIMESTABLES

Children in the Excellent Eagles should have a firm grasp of all the times tables including division facts. Spend some time on a weekly basis exploring multiplication, division and problem solving skills.

However, children will be expected to use the weekly spellings in their writing so learning them is important. Children will also be given 'spot check' tests to make sure they are retaining this information.
