

Homework Non-Negotiables

In addition to the termly homework, we firmly believe that children need to consolidate key skills by completing these tasks.

READING

It is important to listen to your child read for around 20 minutes every day. Discuss the book together, talk about themes and genres, making predictions and links between books that have been read previously.

SPELLINGS

Spelling rules and list shall be given each week with activities to be completed at home. Spelling tests will generally take place weekly. Children should use their spellings in their writing as a way of embedding them. Using the 'Spelling Shed' will also help with the learning of spellings.

TIMESTABLES

Children in the Excellent Eagles should have a firm grasp of all the times tables including division facts. Spend some time on a weekly basis exploring multiplication, division and problem solving skills. They should use 'Timestable Rockstars' to help learn their timestables.

If you have any questions AT ALL about what is expected, what you could do or how you might best help your child, please come and see the class teacher straight away. We will always be happy to help you.

Children will also be given 'spot check' tests to make sure they are retaining this information.
