

Literacy

Our Literacy work will be linked to our Explorers topic.

We will be writing our own poetry, diary entries, recounts and letters. These will be linked to either Pirates or Space.

Children will continue to work on their handwriting and take part in daily phonics.

We will be continuing with our reading maze so please keep reading at home.

Science

In Science we will be focusing on Materials. We will be naming different materials and learning about their properties and uses. We will also think about the suitability of different materials and what we could use to make rockets linked to our Space topic. Children will also learn about recycling and how and why we recycle materials.

Numeracy

This half term, we will focus on:

- Addition and subtraction
- Number and place value
- Fractions
- Volume and capacity
- Position and direction

Children will take part in daily times-table practise.

Geography

In Geography, we will be looking at the world. Children will name and locate the seven continents and five oceans. We will use maps and atlases to locate countries, continents and oceans. We will look at maps and think about how we could travel around the world as well as looking at hot and cold climates.

PE
