

Homework Non-Negotiables

In addition to homework, we firmly believe that children need to consolidate key skills by completing these tasks:

READING

It is important to listen to your child read for at least 15 minutes every day. Discuss the book together, making predictions and links between books that have been read previously.

SPELLINGS

Spelling rules will be given weekly along with tasks to be completed at home. Children should learn their weekly spelling list and use these words in their work. Tests will be given at intervals.

TIMESTABLES

Children in the Wonderful Wolves should have a firm grasp of the 3, 4, 6 & 8 times tables by the end of Year 3. All pupils should be competent in all multiplication tables up to 12 x 12 by the end of Year 4. Spend some time on a weekly basis exploring multiplication, division and problem solving skills.
